Dell Rapids

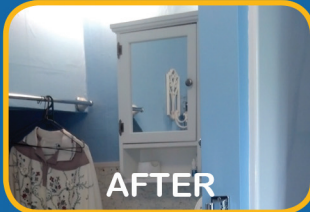
